Subject:	Public Works Departmental Report –June 2025

The City's public works department has 13 dedicated employees that administer, repair, and maintain the city's public infrastructure including traffic signals, streetlights, roads, sidewalks, swales, street signs, stop signs, median landscaping and irrigation, city street trees, storm sewer drainage, and bridges.

The following summarizes the department's operations over the month of June:

Public Works Capital Projects Overview:

N. Collier Blvd./N. Barfield Dr. intersection

- Traffic control and underground water and sewer construction is scheduled to start mid-July.
- MOT Phase I has been reviewed and approved
- Construction Schedule: July 2025 July 2026

Canal Aeration Pilot

- Aerators will be installed July.
- Following the installation of the aerators, a ten-week sampling and testing period will be conducted, covering parameters such as dissolved oxygen (DO), temperature, conductivity, oxidation-reduction potential (ORP), depth, and airflow.
- Construction and Pilot Study Schedule: July 2025 Sept. 2025

Traffic Signal Control Replacements

- Design: May 2025 Nov 2025
- Bidding: Nov 2025 Jan 2026
- Construction: Feb 2026 Aug 2026

Pedestrian Safety Improvements

- Design: May 2025 Oct 2025
- Bidding: Nov 2025 Jan 2026
- Construction: Feb 2026 Aug 2026

Tidal Flushing/Canal Interconnects

- Bids rejected 2024
- Awaiting additional grant funding. The city's grant writer is assisting.
- Re-bid and construction TBD

Sand Hill St. Shared Path

- Design completed
- Bidding: July 2025 Aug 2025
- Construction: Sep. 2025 April 2026

Annual Street Resurfacing (Paving)

Construction: Jul 2025 – Sep 2025

Caxambas Ct. Bridge Replacement

- Bridge development report completed
- City/FDOT water and sewer design agreement execution in progress
- 60% plans: Nov 2025
- 90% plans: May 2026; construction funding agreement between city and FDOT must be executed by May 2026.
- 100% plans: Oct 2026
- Bidding: Dec 2026 Feb 2027
- Construction: Mar 2027 Mar 2028

S. Barfield Dr. Flood Remediation

San Marco Drainage Improvements Project:

The San Marco Drainage project reached 100% completion. All contract work has been finalized in time and within budget. Closeout documentation is in progress. No outstanding construction activities remain.



N. Collier Blvd/N. Barfield Dr. Intersection Improvements

Construction is slated to begin in July. The first phase of construction will consist of replacing the underground water and sewer mains. One southbound traffic lane will be closed during this phase of construction.



Collier Blvd. Irrigation

The city's contractor is disconnecting all roadside (from curb to right of way line) sprinklers from the city's irrigation distribution system. These areas will need to be irrigated by each adjacent property owner if they desire to irrigate as is the case everywhere else on Marco Island. The city's irrigation will be limited to the city's landscaped medians.

Goldenrod Ave. Bridge Rehabilitation

Construction is slated to begin in mid-July. The paving will be stripped from the bridge. The bridge decks will be sealed and a membrane will be installed before the bridge is repaved. Construction of the bridge deck rehabilitation is to take two weeks. One lane with be closed during this time. Traffic will be controlled with a temporary traffic signal.



Advisory Committee Support

In addition to the above projects, PW staff attends and supports the Waterways Advisory Committee, the Hideaway Beach Tax District Board, and the bike lane and shared path strategy group including the preparation of meeting minutes, conducting research, updating the city website related to committee functions, coordinating among committee members, and attending additional meetings, and responding to requests. Staff support of the Beautification Advisory Committee will be transitioned to the Fleet and Facilities department starting in fiscal year 26 on October 1.

Water Quality Action Items

The following table lists the water quality action items being considered or performed by the city. The items appearing in gray text are not recommended, not feasible, and not implemented.

Collier Blvd. from Huron Ct. to the end of Collier Ct. Construction is slated to begin in July. More exfiltration swale project designs are on the way in FY25. The right of way construction standards manual was revised to require that exfiltration swales be constructed as part of the right of way permitting process. Thus far over 20 residential right of way permits include the construction of exfiltration swales.
