Employee News

Louis served in roles including Police Officer, Detective and Detective Sergeant for the NYPD. We are excited for his future service to the MIPD and the City of Marco Island.



Community Oriented Policing



In July 2024, the Marco Island Police Department were invited to the Wesley United Methodist Church to join Camp Able in a day of fun filled activities. Camp Able is an annual summer camp dedicated to providing people of all ages and diverse abilities to connect and enjoy a week of relationship building with friends and counselors. MIPD staff joined in on an afternoon of fun at the water park and even got to show off their patrol vehicle to a few lucky campers. The Marco Island Police Department values relationships with community events such as Camp Able and looks forward to future camps in the coming years.

July Police Activity

Crime Data:

Crime data reflected in the July Activity report contains offense information as reported by the MIPD to the FBI. In July 2024, 61 incidents were reported to the Marco Island Police Department. Total crimes against persons decreased by 3% as this time last year. Property crimes remained the same in July 2024 as this time last year. Miscellaneous crimes showed a decrease of 40% due to a decrease in criminal traffic and hit and run incidents as this time last year. In July 2024, crimes against society, such as DUI incidents, decreased by 50%. The Marco Island Police Department had 9 arrests in July of 2024 for incidents including domestic violence related simple assault, out of county warrant, driving under the influence, disorderly conduct, and criminal traffic incidents.

Note: Multiple criminal offenses may have occurred within some incidents. This reporting aligns with new crime data collection requirements from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and the FBI. This announcement for crime reporting was covered in the February 2022 monthly report. On-criminal incidents are reports that do not have a criminal offense or are information reports. Examples include fraud cases (outside of Marco Island jurisdiction), other agency assists, lost and found items and medical assists.



2023 vs 2024 Incident Crime Trends


In July 2024, there were 37 non-criminal incidents reported. 16% of non-criminal incident reports were comprised of suspicious activities. 13% of reports were referencing assistance to other agencies including Collier EMS, Marco Island Fire Department, and other law enforcement agencies. 32% of non-criminal incident reports are for lost and found property.

July Traffic Patrol

In July 2024, there were 171 traffic citations and warnings issued by the Marco Island Police Department. Of the citations issued 42% were for failure to obey traffic signs or traffic lights. 15% were due to an excess in posted speed. 33% of citations were for operating a motor vehicle with an expired registration or driver's license. Other citations issued were for violations including safety belt infractions, improper passing, and illegal U-turns. In July 2024, the Marco Island Police Department seized 5 licenses during traffic stops due to license suspensions or revocations. 2 license plates were seized during traffic stops.


