Mr. Tim Annett, pickleball player and member of the Marco Island Racquet Center, presented the results of his collaborative effort into approaches and technologies that could reduce the impact of pickleball-playing noise on the neighboring community, along with his proposal to raise private donations and implement a profitable business model to fund and sustain enhanced pickleball activities at the Marco Island Racquet Center.

Messrs. Dale Van Scoyk and Jeorg Duebel of PSM Consulting LLC provided in depth insight into the noise evaluation and noise mitigation technologies employed at several existing pickleball facilities.

Attorney Zach Lombardo, Woodward, Pires & Lombardo, P.A., on behalf of Mr. Annett, requested

clarification of the Council's direction and a clear set of parameters to frame the expectations of the City regarding pickleball play at the Marco Island Racquet Center to inform Mr. Annett's efforts going forward.

City of Marco Island Fleet & Facilities Manager Joseph Parrilli outlined the proposed installation of sound mitigation panels at the Marco Island Racquet Center by the Fleet & Facilities Staff along the ten (10) foot tall east, west, and south sides of the existing pickleball courts with material supplies by SLNCR Panels, LLC, along with the redeployment of the facility's currently-installed Acoustiblock panels around the pickleball "stadium court" to help insulate the noise from that location.

He requested approval of the contract with SLNCR Panels, LLC to procure the new sound mitigation material for the existing pickleball courts.

No members of the public came forward to offer comment.

Chair Palumbo received verbal consensus from the Council to have City Staff secure pricing for installing the sound mitigation panels along the existing ten (10) foot pickleball courts from Sound Seal (eNoise Control), the recommended sound mitigation panel company and product identified by Mr. Tim Annett in his Marco Island Racquet Center Presentation (Agenda Item 15a).

City of Marco Island Fleet & Facilities Manager Joseph Parrilli briefly described the concerns voiced by the community and the members of the City of Marco Island Parks & Recreation Advisory Committee regarding the current inability to restrict access to the Marco Island Racquet Center pickleball "stadium court" during non-business hours at that facility.

Mr. Parrilli requested that, upon the previously-approved removal of the racquetball building at the Marco Island Racquet Center [Editorial Note: approved by the City Council at its March 2, 2026 meeting], the Council's approval be given to award a contract to MOR Sports Group in the amount of \$11,097.60 to install fencing and a lockable gate to secure the pickleball "stadium court" from after-hours play.

City of Marco Island Public Works Director Justin Martin briefly described the age and condition of the City's eleven (11) intersection traffic controllers currently in use to manage traffic and pedestrian safety at the intersections on the Island, and he outlined the scope of the proposed project and its expected benefits to public safety and ongoing traffic management system reliability.

Chair Palumbo complimented Interim City Manager Casey Lucius and Marco Island Police Chief Tracy Frazzano on their expanded focus and reporting of nightly beach activity.

Chair Palumbo reminded the Council that decisions remained to be made regarding its process for selecting a permanent City Manager, and he indicated his intention to have the Council discuss this item at its next meeting. The Council discussed his recommendation, and gave him unanimous consensus to direct the City Staff to invite the top five (5) City Manager candidates identified at the Council's April 6, 2026 meeting to participate in a public, full Council, panel interview at a City Council Workshop on May 11, 2026. The Council directed that the Workshop begin at 11:00 A.M.

Interim City Manager Casey Lucius recommended that the Council view the videos of the public interview process that was recently employed by the Collier County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and the Collier County Board of Commissioners in their selection of Executive Managers for their respective organizations. Chair Palumbo opened discussion on this topic with an expressed desire to reach a level of Council consensus on a proposed general obligation bond amount that could be brought before the electorate on August 18, 2026. He prepared, and included with the Agenda, two alternatives (\$16 million and \$23 million) for consideration by the Council, and Vice-Chair Champagne indicated his desire to have the Council consider a third alternative at \$34 million.

Interim City Manager Casey Lucius reminded the Council that its approval of a proposed general obligation bond amount must be in the form of a formal Resolution that includes the proposed ballot language and a specified bond amount before it can be voted upon by the Council for inclusion on the August 18th ballot.

Upon surveying individual Councilor support for the three general obligation bond amounts noted above, Chair Palumbo directed the City Staff to prepare two separate Resolutions - one at \$23 million, and one at \$34 million - for the Council's consideration and vote at a May, 2026 City Council Meeting.

Chair Palumbo acknowledged the depth of information provided by Councilor Gray in the development of his recommendations for modifying the City's Noise Ordinance, and he invited the members of the Council to share their thoughts and questions. City Attorney Alan Gabriel was also called upon by various members of the Council to provide insight and opinion on several recommendations advanced in Councilor

Gray's White Paper relative to current State law, and the Council's 2022 - 2023 experience with Ordinance 22-08 (Transient Single-family Home (RSF) Rental Registration Program).

Chair Palumbo solicited, but did not receive, Council consensus to direct the City Staff to prepare a revised Noise Ordinance for First Reading at a future meeting of the Council. The Council did, however, endorse Interim City Manager Casey Lucius' recommendation that the Council review, discuss, and debate the elements of a revised Noise Ordinance to be prepared by City Attorney Alan Gabriel at a future meeting of the Council.
