



City Manager – City Council Report April 6, 2026

Team Wins: Wins for the City Council, staff, our residents and the environment!

1. The City now has more residents signed up for autopay for utility bills than were signed up before making the new payment change. The current number of customers signed up for auto pay is 5,454 compared to 5,438. We are continuing to work with customers as they come to City Hall to help them sign up for autopay.
2. On March 20th I met with the Chamber of Commerce Government Affairs Committee and agreed to resume monthly meetings between the Chamber leadership and City Management. These monthly meetings had not occurred for several years.
3. Marco Island will be featured in Florida Trail Towns program “Florida Crossroads” and they will interview Councilor Schwan.
4. The County Manager and I are planning a joint Commission-Council meeting for late summer. More details are coming soon.
5. Congratulations to our new Chief Building Official, Don Davis. Don has worked for the City of Marco Island since 2016 as a Plans Examiner and Building Inspector.

General Updates for the Council and Public:

1. To address traffic congestion on Yellowbird and 6th Ave, the City will be constructing signs and delineators on Collier Blvd to prevent vehicles from turning left from Yellowbird on to Collier Blvd. Vehicles will still be able to turn left from Collier onto Yellowbird.
2. April 15th is tax day and also the last day of the Farmer’s Market (it is also a certain Council member’s birthday!).
3. There is a beach cleanup on April 11th at 8:00am at South Beach.
