Employee News



On November 8th, MIPD employees teamed up with Meals of Hope and other Marco Island community members at the Marco Island Charter Middle School for a service filled Saturday. Our team helped create more than 205,000 meals to fight hunger this holiday season. These employees exemplify *better together* by lifting families in need.

Community Oriented Policing

On November 5th, the MIPD held a Bike Rodeo and Bicycle Safety Event at Marco Island Charter Middle School. The riders were able to learn essential safety tips, practice their riding skills, all while having fun. We are thankful to the Island Bicycle Shop and Sun N Fun Sports for assisting us with this fun-filled, educational, and exciting event.



November Police Activity Crime

Report:

In November 2025, 55 incidents were reported to the Marco Island Police Department. Total crimes against persons decreased by 92% (1 vs. 13) compared to the same time last year. Property crimes increased by 33% (8 vs. 6) compared to last year. Miscellaneous crimes decreased by 30% (7 vs. 10). In November 2025, there were no crimes against society. The Marco Island Police Department had 4 arrests in November 2025 for fleeing and eluding, out of county warrant, hit and run, and domestic violence.


Note: Multiple criminal offenses may have occurred within some incidents. This reporting aligns with new crime data collection requirements from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and the FBI. This announcement for crime reporting was covered in the February 2022 monthly report. Non-criminal incidents are reports that do not have a criminal offense or are information reports. Examples include fraud cases (outside of Marco Island jurisdiction), other agency assists, lost and found items and medical assists.

2025. vs 2024 Incident Trend

In November 2025, there were 36 non-criminal incidents reported. 8% of non-criminal incident reports were comprised of suspicious incidents. 11% of reports referred to assistance to other agencies including Collier EMS, Marco Island Fire Department, and other law enforcement agencies. 28% of non-criminal incident reports are for lost and found property. The Marco Island Police Department will accept found property into our property and evidence department for safekeeping until an owner can be located. 6% of reports were due to animal bites.




This data highlights the diverse range of incidents that the department responds to, emphasizing both public safety and community support.

Traffic Patrol

In November 2025, there were 153 traffic citations and warnings issued by the Marco Island Police Department. Of the 58 written citations issued, 41% were for failure to obey traffic signs or traffic lights. 21% of citations were for operating a motor vehicle with an expired registration or driver's license. 28% of citations were issued for other citations such as sunshade tint, improper turns, or seatbelt violations. In November 2025, there was 1 criminal notice to appear citation due to a hit and run. 1 driver's license and 1 license plate was seized during traffic stops.

In November 2025, MIPD officers conducted 121 bicycle and e-bike stops. All stops resulted in corrective actions with lights, bells, and helmets distributed as needed. Informational packets were also supplied to riders.



Detective Bureau Monthly Investigative Report

Detective Bureau data reflects the number of cases assigned to the bureau each month. These totals do not account for active investigations carried over from previous months and, therefore, do not reflect the bureau's overall caseload.

• The Detective Bureau handled a 40.7% decrease (16 vs 27) in Battery/Assault cases in 2025 compared to the same period in 2024. There has been a 2.7% increase (115 vs 112) in Suspicious Incident cases. There has been a 8.5% decrease (43 vs 47) in Theft cases when compared to the same period last year.

November Marine Report

The Marine Report reflects activities conducted by MIPD Marine Officers while patrolling Marco Island's waterways and canals. These activities include proactive patrols to enforce marine and environmental regulations and promote boater safety. In November, total marine events rose by 41% (373 vs 246) compared to the same period last year.

Beach Patrol Events decreased slightly in the month of November, compared to the previous month. Weather impacted the number of beach visitors we had for the month. Code officers continue to provide service to beach goers daily.

November 2025 Code Enforcement Officer (CEO) Report:







Code Enforcement Officer (CEO) activity in November 2025 remained predominantly self-initiated, with self-initiated investigations exceeding dispatched cases by a substantial margin. Parking Citations increased by 52% when compared to last month. Weed violations have decreased by 38% when compared to the number of violations last month. Trash violations have shown a decrease each month since September. The high volume of self-initiated investigations underscores the proactive efforts of CEOs in identifying and addressing issues before they escalate or are formally reported.

Hours were 48% higher (156 vs 105) compared to the same time last year.

Notably, in November 2025, 12,496 more calls for service were officer-initiated in the field, than being driven by 911 or administrative dispatch. This reflects a continued emphasis on proactive policing.
