Employee News

We are glad to welcome them as a part of our team and look forward to their future service and dedication to the community.



Community Oriented Policing

On October 30, 2024, the Marco Island Police Department, Marco Island Police Foundation and the Collier County Sheriff's Office served some candy and fun at the St. Mark's Episcopal Church trunk-or-treat event! Captain Dave Ennis, Officer George Guyer and Reserve Officer Bill Miller met community members, students and some friendly characters along the way. MIPD Reserve Officers and the Marco Island Police Foundation also assisted on October 31, 2024, providing traffic control and road safety for a Happy Halloween.

October Police Activity

Crime Data:

In October 2024, 58 incidents were reported to the Marco Island Police Department. Total crimes against persons increased by 33% compared to this time last year. Property crimes increased by 38% in October 2024. Miscellaneous crimes decreased by 25%. In October 2024, crimes against society, such as DUI incidents, decreased by 25%. The Marco Island Police Department had 10 arrests in October of 2024 for incidents including DUI, narcotic violations, weapon law violations, criminal traffic, aggravated assault, shoplifting, and an out of county warrant.

Note: Multiple criminal offenses may have occurred within some incidents. This reporting aligns with new crime data collection requirements from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and the FBI. This announcement for crime reporting was covered in the February 2022 monthly report. On-criminal incidents are reports that do not have a criminal offense or are information reports. Examples include fraud cases (outside of Marco Island jurisdiction), other agency assists, lost and found items and medical assists.

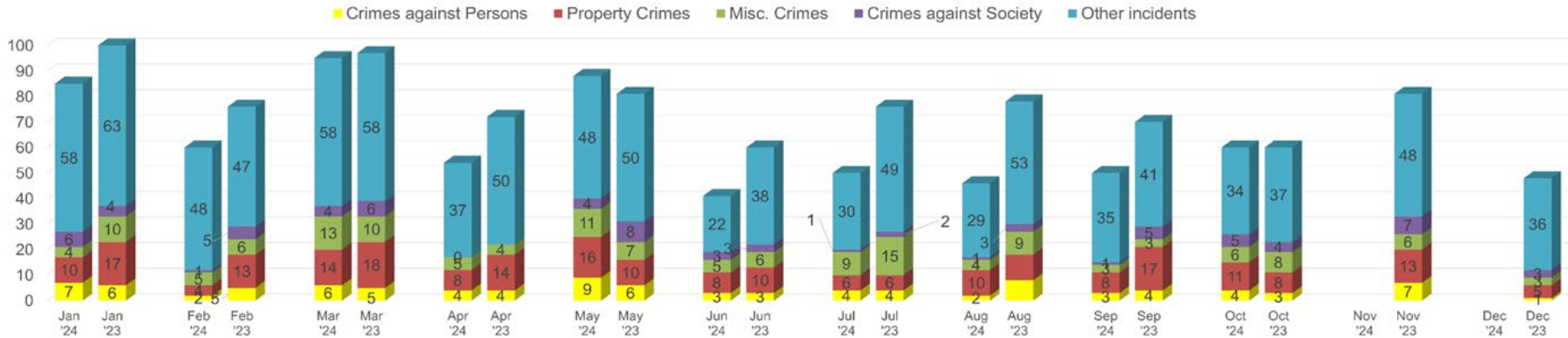

2023 vs 2024 Incident Crime Trends

In October 2024, there were 27 non-criminal incidents reported. 22% of non-criminal incident reports were comprised of suspicious activities. 15% of reports were referencing assistance to other agencies including Collier EMS, Marco Island Fire Department, and other law enforcement agencies. 11% of non-criminal incident reports are for lost and found property.

2024 v. 2023 Incident Trends by Crime Category, Non-Crime



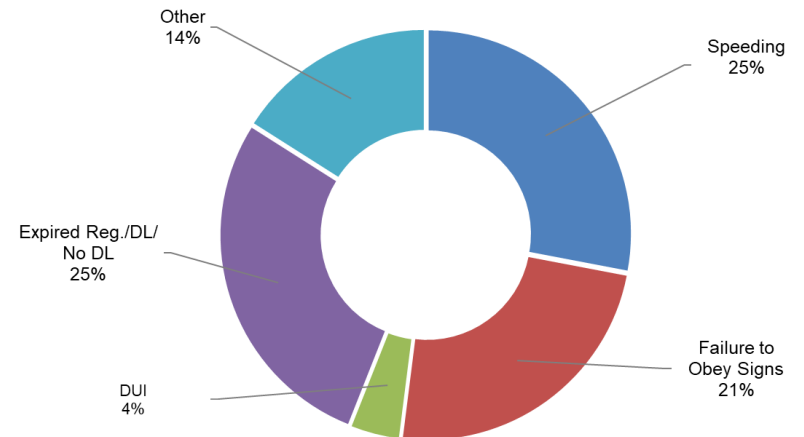

October Traffic Patrol

In October 2024, there were 79 traffic citations and warnings issued by the Marco Island Police Department. Of the citations issued 21% were for failure to obey traffic signs or traffic lights. 25% were due to an excess in posted speed. 25% of citations were for operating a motor vehicle with an expired registration or driver's license. Other citations issued were for violations including safety belt infractions, improper passing, and failure to stop for an emergency vehicle. In October 2024, the Marco Island Police Department seized 5 licenses and 2 license plates during traffic stops due to license suspensions or revocations. In October 2024, the Marco Island Police Department had 4 criminal traffic arrests for driving with no license, driving with a suspended license with knowledge, and for driving under the influence.
