



City Manager – City Council Report June 15, 2026

Team Wins: Wins for the City Council, staff, our residents and the environment!

1. On June 3, 2026 the City received a grant reimbursement for over \$2 million for sanitary lift stations portable generators. This will be a reimbursement to the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund from FEMA through the FL Department of Emergency Management following Hurricane Irma in 2017.
2. The City Manager received the Florida City and County Management Association (FCCMA) "If you care, you do" award for 2026.
3. We will be highlighting City Councilors and City staff members in social media videos to recognize and celebrate America 250! Our celebration will culminate with fireworks off the coast of Resident's Beach on July 4th.
4. Marco Island has been featured on the Florida Channel for becoming a Florida Trail Town. The link to view the video is on the City's homepage.

General Updates for the Council and Public:

1. The City is hosting a Hurricane Preparedness Town Hall on June 22nd at noon in the Community Room at 51 Bald Eagle Drive. Rob Duns, Meteorologist from Gulf Coast News will be our featured speaker. Please visit the City's website and click on Emergency Management to learn more about hurricane preparations.
2. The City's property and liability insurance are increasing by 10% for the fiscal year 2027. Additionally, employee health insurance premiums are estimated to increase 8%. These increases will be reflected in the budget and discussed at the July operating budget workshop.
3. There will be a referendum on the August 18 ballot for Marco Island voters to vote on a \$23 million bond. This bond will pay for the replacement of the Caxambas and Goldenrod bridges, repair of three additional bridges, and paving of roads over the next ten years.
