8. Proclamations and Presentations

a. ID 24-3491 Proclamation - National Safe Boating Week - May 18 to May 24, 2024

City Council Chair Jared Grifoni proclaimed May 18 - 24, 2024 as National Safe Boating Week for the City of Marco Island, and he presented the Proclamation to representatives of the Marco Island Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla and Ms. Nanette Rivera, Commander of the Marco Island Sail & Power Squadron Club, along with 30 Club representatives and other safe boating supporters. Ms. Rivera thanked all who attended, and she shared several safety messages on behalf of the organization. She received a warm round of applause from all present.

b. <u>ID 24-3556</u> Proclamation - National Public Works Week - May 19 to May 25, 2024

City Council Chair Jared Grifoni proclaimed May 19 - 25, 2024 as National Public Works Week, and he presented the Proclamation to City of Marco Island Public Works Director Justin Martin, and eleven members of the City's Public Works Department.

City Manager McNees praised the efforts of the Public Works Team in acting quickly and quietly to restore services when needed to ensure the safety of residents and visitors to the Island.

The members of the Marco Island Public Works Team received a warm round of applause from all present.

9. Citizens' Comments on Items Not Scheduled for Public Hearing and Items Other Than Those Appearing on the Agenda

Ms. Denise Holmes (Bluebird Ave.), Founder of Families of Grace, a non-profit organization dedicated to educating the public in the use of NARCAN anti-opiate sprays, presented City of Marco Island Fire Chief Chris Byrne with a Certificate of Appreciation and multiple boxes of NARCAN to assist the City's first responders in addressing victims of opiate overdosing. At the request of Chair Grifoni, Fire Chief Byrne briefly described how the City prepares itself and educates its citizens to respond to opiate overdose situations.

Mr. Paul Sellers (E. Elkam Cir.), owner of Art Sellers Signs, requested City assistance and action in recognizing and documenting the parking spaces that Collier County acknowledges as being associated with a C-5 commercial unit that he recently purchased at 814 E. Elkcam Circle, Unit 101B.

Ms. Cindi Boynton (N. Barfield Dr.) recounted an accident involving her automobile and a 14 year old e-bike rider traveling on the sidewalk in front of her home. She requested that the Council consider adopting restrictions that address the age, certification, and allowable top speed for e-bike operators on the Island's pedestrian walkways.

City of Marco Island Fleet & Facilities Manager Miguel Carballo reviewed the process for soliciting and obtaining responsible bidders to renew the spray park at Frank E. Mackle Park, and he addressed several questions from members of the Council.

d. ID 24-3636 Resolution - Floodplain Variance Request (SF-22-02623) for Property Located at 230 Polynesia Court, Marco Island, FL 34145 - Kelli DeFedericis, CFM, Floodplain Coordinator, Community Affairs/Building Services

Marco Island City Clerk Joan Taylor read Resolution 24-26 into the record by title only.

City Floodplain Coordinator Kelli DeFedericis explained the rationale for the requested variance, and noted that: 1) the final finished floor elevation of the home meets Federal and State requirements, but is below the City's required final finished floor elevation level, and; 2) the proposed variance allowance of 8.6' NAVD only applies to the final finished floor elevation of the structure, and not to the elevated height of the added outdoor mechanical equipment that services the home. This equipment is required to be placed at a height of at least 9.0' NAVD.

Public Comment

Mr. Ryan Williams, President of Kevin Williams Construction, requested that consideration be given to the louvered wall enclosure that his company placed around the outdoor mechanical equipment that is currently installed below 9.0' NAVD to mitigate the danger cited in the City Staff's report.

[Editorial Note: The Council's action on Resolution 24-26 only addressed the variance to the structure's final finished floor elevation as originally proposed by City Staff, and did not include the construction company's variance request relative to the elevation of the mechanical equipment servicing the home]

MOTION by Councilor Folley seconded by Councilor Palumbo, that Resolution 24-26 - Floodplain Variance Request (SF-22-02623) for the Property Located at 230 Polynesia Court, Marco Island, FL 34145, be Approved. MOTION CARRIED BY THE FOLLOWING COUNCIL VOTE:

e. ID 24-3628 2024 City Council Meeting Schedule Discussion - Joan Taylor, City Clerk

Marco Island City Clerk Joan Taylor briefly outlined the Council's scheduled Future Agenda topics that could be affected by reducing the number of Council meetings planned for July and August of 2024, and members of the Council discussed eliminating the first scheduled meeting in each of those two months.

Chair Grifoni solicited and received Council consensus to direct the City Staff to remove July 8, 2024 and

August 5, 2024 from the Council's schedule of future meetings.

13. Items Removed from the Consent Agenda

No items were removed from the Consent Agenda for further discussion at this meeting of the Council.

14. Council Communications & Future Agenda

Councilor Folley requested that City Community Affairs Director Daniel Smith reach out to the business owner who brought his undocumented parking records concern to the Council during Citizens' Comments (Agenda Item 9).

In response to the concern raised during Citizens' Comments regarding the operation of e-bikes the Island, Councilor Folley asked City Manager McNees to reach out to the Chair of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC) for the Collier County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to obtain that Advisory Committee's insight on the recent recommendations that were proposed for Collier County on this issue. Councilor Blonna suggested that input from the e-bike rental company owners on the Island be solicited as well. Council members agreed that City Manager McNees will report on the MPO's recommendations regarding the use and operation of e-bikes, and that the public will be invited to comment on the management and operation of e-bikes on Marco Island.

Councilor Folley also confirmed the submission of his resignation letter as a member of the Marco Island City Council to the Marco Island City Clerk effective November 5, 2024.

Councilor Palumbo highlighted the positive comments that Fire Chief Byrnes, Police Chief Frazzano, and members of the City Staff have recently received from members of the public, and he thanked all for continuing to work together to address the concerns of the community.

Councilor Blonna noted the recent news story regarding the treatment and rehabilitation of a female burrowing owl at the von Arx Wildlife Hospital, and he commended Field Biologist Brittany Piersma and the Owl Watch volunteers who nourished and cared for the owl's baby owl chicks on the Island while the mother owl was undergoing treatment.

ID 23-3122 Future Agenda Items

Chair Grifoni requested that a review of the e-bike operating recommendations recently discussed by the Collier County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) be placed on a Future Agenda for the Council.

16. City Manager's Report

City Manager Mike McNees advised the Council that the Neighborhood Information Meeting (NIM) regarding Phase I of the pickleball improvement project for the Marco Island Racquet Center has been posted and will occur on Friday, May 31, 2024.

Mr. McNees also alerted the Council to likely changes to Collier County's Advanced Life Support Policy Standards that are currently under discussion with Collier County's Board of Commissioners, and he outlined several potential changes that could affect the administration and application of emergency life support services by City of Marco Island personnel.

City Manager McNees concluded by referencing an article in the May 10, 2024 Marco Eagle newspaper regarding capital improvement projects across Collier County that remain unfinished after the expiration of the temporary Collier County 1% Sales Tax levy on December 31, 2023. He commended the Council for fully funding and completing the City's Fire Station 50 and Veterans' Community Parks projects prior to the expiration of the 1% Sales Tax levy.
