September Police Activity

Crime Data:

In September 2024, 51 incidents were reported to the Marco Island Police Department. Total crimes against persons decreased by 70% compared to the same time last year. Property crimes decreased by 53% in September 2024. Miscellaneous crimes remained the same as this time last year. In September 2024, crimes against society, such as DUI incidents, decreased by 80%. The Marco Island Police Department had 5 arrests in September of 2024 for incidents including shoplifting, narcotic paraphernalia, motor vehicle theft, and criminal traffic incidents.


Note: Multiple criminal offenses may have occurred within some incidents. This reporting aligns with new crime data collection requirements from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and the FBI. This announcement for crime reporting was covered in the February 2022 monthly report. On-criminal incidents are reports that do not have a criminal offense or are information reports. Examples include fraud cases (outside of Marco Island jurisdiction), other agency assists, lost and found items and medical assists.


2023 vs 2024 Incident Crime Trends

In September 2024, there were 30 non-criminal incidents reported. 20% of non-criminal incident reports were comprised of suspicious activities. 14% of reports referred to assistance to other agencies including Collier EMS, Marco Island Fire Department, and other law enforcement agencies. 23% of non-criminal incident reports are for lost and found property.



September Traffic Patrol

In September 2024, there were 87 traffic citations and warnings issued by the Marco Island Police Department. Of the total citations, 34% were issued for failure to obey traffic signs or traffic lights. 21% were due to an excess in posted speed. 38% of citations were issued for operating a motor vehicle with an expired registration or driver's license. Other citations issued were for violations including safety belt infractions, improper passing, and failure to stop for an emergency vehicle. In September 2024, the Marco Island Police Department seized 4 licenses during traffic stops due to license suspensions or revocations. Also, 2 criminal traffic arrests for driving with no license and driving with an expired registration, 2nd offense.

Detective Bureau data reflects cases that have been assigned to the Detective Bureau per month. Totals are not reflective of active investigations that have been assigned in previous months and therefore do not reflect overall caseload.







The ceremony alerts members that a comrade has perished in the line of duty and allows us to honor their bravery and sacrifice.

On September 14, 2024, Marco Island Police Marine Officer Josh Ferris and Marco Island Fire Rescue Captain Paramedic Jeffrey Kutzke were given the Community Champion Award at the Collier County Readiness Summit for their brave efforts during Hurricane Ian which resulted in lives saved.

Both were recognized for their response to Goodland during Hurricane Ian. The residents were trapped by rising waters and Officer Ferris braved the storm to rescue 12 people, using a fire service high water vehicle.

Through his adventures, Officer George protects and serves his community using courage, bravery and fairness to do what's right. Sounds like our own Officer George!
