#### 1. <u>ID 19-185</u> Selection of Finalists for the City Manager Position

(Editorial History: At the February 4, 2019 meeting, City Council received an update via telephone from Mr. Ken Parker, ICMA/FCCMA Senior Advisor, outlining the proposed process for the selection of a new City Manager. Mr. Parker attended the February 19, 2019 meeting, and presented the position profile and recruitment brochure for Council's approval. These were approved with some modifications and, as directed by Council, the recruitment process began on February 20. During the application period which ended March 22, the City received 60 applications. More than 200 individuals were contacted directly about the opening. The ad was placed with the Florida League of Cities, the Florida City-County Management Association, International City-County Management Association and other sites. The job announcement has had over 970 views.)

*Florida City and County Management Association (FCCMA) Senior Advisor Ken Parker explained the process going forward and answered Council's questions and concerns.*

## ID 18-726 Future Agenda Items

**Council Communications** 

Vice-Chair Rios commented on his position paper regarding the ban of smoking on the beaches. He expressed his disappointment in his motion not getting a second to at least have a discussion at the last meeting. He noted just because a Councilor makes the second, they do not necessarily have to vote for it. He is asking to bring it back for reconsideration for discussion.

Councilor Honig said he has a serious issue with the conduct of the meetings. He quoted section 7-b-8 in the Rules of Procedures which says "City Councilors shall refrain from initiating a discussion with citizens during the "Community Forum," except to clarify points raised by citizens, and only if the Chair has not already done so. See Section 7-c-3 which says "Public should be entitled to a respectful and prompt response to matters of concern, even on an individual basis if appropriate. The Chair may ask for a response from the City Manager or staff." He believes citizens who come forward and disparage City Council need to be called out and the Chair could allow Councilors to respond to them.

Chair Brechnitz responded to Councilor Honig and noted he will not engage in a confrontational style with the citizens.

Councilor Roman commented on the upcoming water quality workshop where it was discussed to focus on policy decisions and asked Interim City Manager David Harden to look at the webinar topics to see if any of those should be incorporated into some of the policy topics. She would like to receive information during that workshop on the number of city, public and private outfalls that drain to the canals. Her second item pertains to the water utility fence on State Road 951 where citizens of the Falling Waters Community expressed concerns with the condition of the fence and the City Manager is looking into that matter. She thanked City Attorney Alan Gabrial and Robert Meyers for conducting the committee orientation and ethics training session held on March 13, 2019 and the volunteer citizens who attended.

Councilor Grifoni noted the reason he did not second Vice-Chair Rios' motion at the last City Council meeting to ban smoking on the beach is because there is no companion bill in the house. He said companion bill HB-237 was withdrawn on February 26, 2019 and had no votes scheduling committee in the house so it wasn't going anywhere at the legislative level this time around. He said it was introduced at the Senate on March 5, 2019 and there were no hearings up to the last Council meeting. His second comment referenced the water quality webinar and said the meetings can be viewed after the fact. He noted he attended the webinar but did not feel it was appropriate to comment for a potential Sunshine Law violation. He noted there were technical difficulties with Council's emails and they may not have all been received. It has been corrected now and he urged citizens to reach back out to him if he did not reply.

Councilor Reed echoed Councilor Grifoni's reasons for not seconding Vice-Chair Rios's motion to ban smoking on the beach. He commented on the strategic planning wrap up meeting regarding the vision statement scheduled for May 28 and questioned when that date was scheduled. He is requesting that additional meetings be scheduled the same week as a regular meeting.

Councilor Young spoke about the next water quality workshop and would like to add Mr. Don Rainey to the agenda.

Chair Brechnitz issued a complaint regarding the webinar. He noted there were numerous City Councilors participating in the webinar and Councilor Young made a passionate plea for a water utility to be formed which eliminated the other Councilors from participating from that moment forward due to Sunshine Law violations. He is asking in the future to Councilors to be aware of their settings.

Councilor Roman asked Interim City Manager David Harden to look into bringing back the inactive Beach Steward Program.

Councilor Grifoni would like to add an Arbor Day Proclamation for the next City Council meeting.

Councilor Reed would like to add a discussion on a review of staff utilization impacting water quality issues to the next water quality workshop.

Vice-Chair Rios would like to bring back the discussion on Senate Bill 218, banning smoking on the beach.
