Opening Up America Again Guidelines

Summary

The federal government has unveiled Guidelines for Opening Up America Again, a three-phase approach based on the advice of public health experts. A one-page overview of the three phases for individuals and employers is attached. These Guidelines also identify six proposed Gating Criteria. The federal proposal is that each of these criteria would have to be met to proceed to the next “Phase” of reopening, as defined on the following page. The Gating Criteria are listed as follows:

1. Downward trajectory of influenza-like illnesses reported within a 14 day period; AND
2. Downward trajectory of COVID-like syndromic cases reported within a 14-day period; AND
3. Downward trajectory of documented cases within a 14-day period; OR
4. Downward trajectory of positive tests as a percent of total tests within a 14-day period (flat or increased volume of tests); AND
5. Hospitals treat all patients without crisis care; AND
6. Robust testing program in place for at-risk healthcare workers, including emerging antibody testing.

The “Opening up America Again” document noted that local officials may need to tailor the application of these criteria to local circumstances, and Governors should work on a regional basis to satisfy these criteria and to progress through the phases outlined in the attachment.

The Collier County Department of Health is monitoring each of these gating criteria and provides a status report to the County and local municipalities once per week.

It is expected that on or shortly following Monday, April 27 the State of Florida will release a set of Gating Criteria similar to these issued by the federal officials. Those criteria will be provided for discussion purposes at the April 29 meeting, the existing federal recommendations are included here for reference in reviewing the issues.
