Re: Fire Rescue Monthly Report

Public Education/Community Outreach

- During the month of June, Staff certified 49 CPR & 13 1st Aid students.
- On June 11th, staff assisted with the “Teen Extravaganza” at Mackle Park.
- On June 12th, staff assisted with “Safety Day” at the YMCA.
- June 14-18 – Staff conducted the Police/Fire Youth Academy, teaching students the various duties and skills required to be a Police Officer or Firefighter. This annual summer program has proven to be a great success with a waiting list of applicants each year.



Significant Incidents

- On June 6th, crews responded to a 3-car accident at N. Collier Blvd. and Barfield Dr. with minor damage and injuries.
- On June 14th, fire crews responded to commercial vehicle fire on Holly Ct.
- On June 15th, crews responded to a 2-car accident on n. Collier Blvd. Moderate damage to both vehicle and no injuries to the occupants.

- On June 21st, fire crews responded to the report of a fire near the ceiling of the Marco Presbyterian Church. The fire was found in the stage lighting in the main sanctuary. Thanks to the prompt recognition from the church staff, MIFR was able to extinguish the fire with minimal damage.
- On June 21st, fire crews responded to a garage fire on Kendall Dr. Upon arrival crews found a fully involved car on fire in the garage. The fire was extinguished with very minor damage to the home; however, the vehicle was a total loss.
- On June 25th, fire crews responded to a stove fire in a south Collier condo. The fire was extinguished with only minor smoke damage to the unit.

Marine Incidents

For the reporting period, the Fire Boat responded to 10 MERT incidents. These included- a subject with a cardiac emergency in Marco Pass, a child with a head laceration in Little Marco Pass, a boat with 8 soles stuck on a sand bar near Dollar Bay, 2 canoers in distress and 6 people stuck on the sand bar in the Caxambas Pass area (both were storm related).
