Recognition

- Captain James Pope, badge # 51, retired on August 15, 2021. Jim began his career with the Department
 July 15, 1996 and progressed through the ranks to his current position of Captain. Jim has been a
 steadfast leader that has made significant contributions throughout his career including serving as a
 peer fitness trainer, a long-serving member of the firefighter pension board, a member of the Combat
 Challenge Team, and most recently assisting with policy/procedure development.
- Firefighter Paramedic Chris Bowden was promoted to the rank of Captain. Chris has made significant contributions to the Department throughout his career, most notable is his leadership of the Departments public education programs. He plans and instructs many programs including the Police Fire Academy, the Middle School CPR program and fire safety children's programs utilizing the Departments safety house.

Additionally, Chris is a state certified Fire Instructor and faculty Fire Instructor at the Florida Southwestern State College Fire Academy.

Significant Incidents

- On Aug 6th, crews responded to a 2-car accident on Elkcam Cir & Barfield Dr. Minor injuries, with moderate damage to both vehicles.
- On Aug 15th, crews responded to a single car accident (vehicle rollover) on Bald Eagle Dr., with major vehicle damage.
- On Aug 21st, fire crews responded to an equipment fire on a vacant lot in Goodland. The fire was contained a small trailer, lawn mower and a golf cart.
- On Aug 22nd, fire crews responded to smoke in a high-rise building, in the Cape Marco area. The smoke was due to a problem with the main electric circuit (transformer); LCEC assisted in mitigating the problem.
- <u>Marine Incidents-</u> For the reporting period, the Fire Boat responded to 6 MERT incidents. These included- a traumatic leg injury on Keewaydin, distress jet skier in Caxambas Pass, and a kayaker in distress near Dickman's Point.
