JULY 5, 2019 PLANNING BOARD SUMMARY AND RECOMMENDATION

The Planning Board considered this request and provided for public input at their July 5, 2019 meeting. The request was presented to the Planning Board and their questions primarily centered on the process of vacating the easement and how it had been addressed in the past.
